



Salzburg College Summer Session I 2017

May 14 – June 17, 2017

The Summer Session at Salzburg College offers an introduction to various aspects of Austrian and European culture. Most courses emphasize the special opportunities provided by the Salzburg setting. Field experience, including visits to historical sites, to cultural and professional institutions and the attendance of musical events constitute an important part of the program.

Courses

Understanding Austria: History, Politics and Culture (3 hrs)

From the Habsburg empire to the modern state.

Economics and Politics of the EU (3 hrs)

An introduction to the process and institutions of European political and economic integration.

Cultural Business and Marketing (3 hrs)

An examination of the cultural business and how marketing works in this industry in Europe.

History of Music-Baroque and Classical Period (3 hrs)

An introduction to the musical heritage of Europe from the Baroque to the Classical Period.

The Mozart Project (3hrs)

Personal study projects combining research and performance. For music majors.

Vocal and Instrumental Arranging (3hrs)

An introduction to the musical craft of arranging as related to the setting of music for various combinations of instruments.

Music Performance (3 hrs)

Private instruction for music majors. Practice facilities are provided.

Public performance opportunity.

German Language Studies (3 hrs)

at Beginning, Intermediate, and Advanced levels.

Austrian Literature and Culture (3 hrs)

An examination of 20th century Austrian literature against the background of the country's history, politics and culture.

Students are expected to enroll in **two courses** for a total of **6 semester credit hours**. Salzburg College reserves the right to cancel a course if less than 5 students enroll.

Field Trips

A four-day trip to Vienna, Austria's historical capital, will provide a broad range of experiences related to history, art, music, and modern life. In addition, a variety of local field trips and excursions constitute an integrated part of the academic program. There is also some time for independent travel on weekends.

Housing

To maximize cultural involvement, students live either in Austrian families or share a room with an Austrian student in a dormitory where they also take their breakfasts and dinners. Family accommodations are normally reserved for students up to the age of 26. Weekday lunches are provided by Salzburg College.

European Studies Program: \$ 5,754

The cost includes tuition, room and board, local excursions and social events, a 4-day trip to Vienna (no meals other than breakfast), a day trip to Upper Austria and a day trip to the Salzkammergut. Cost does not include transatlantic transportation.

Music Program: \$ 6,132

As above, including music performance instruction and final concert arrangements.
