

Other Professional Development Opportunities

In addition to its opportunities abroad, ICISP also sponsors retreats, workshops, and seminars to its members. In addition, ICISP member institutions are encouraged to share professional development opportunities with one another. Past offerings include Fulbright Hays projects, the Illinois International Negotiation Modules Project (INMP), and others. As professional development opportunities are scheduled, ICISP representatives will receive e-mail announcements.

Who Participates?

ICISP professional development opportunities are available to faculty, staff, and administrators of participating ICISP member colleges in Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin. Please check with your ICISP representative for institution-specific requirements.

How Do I Apply?

Applicants must follow their home institution and ICISP procedures for consideration. Proper approval is required from the home institution. Professional development opportunities take careful planning as each program has a separate application process and timeline. Contact your ICISP representative for details concerning your particular program of interest.

Travel Expectations

All participants will be responsible for any meals not provided in the formal program, transportation for the pre-departure orientation, transportation to and from the U.S. airport of departure, international health insurance, and fees associated with acquiring a passport and/or visa. Please note that all participants are also required to participate in a pre-departure orientation and will be expected to assist in future program recruitment upon their return.

Professional development opportunities require advance planning.



Professional Development Opportunities



ICISP offers a variety of professional development opportunities for faculty, staff & administrators.

SEMESTER OPPORTUNITIES

Participation includes salary paid for by the home college, accommodations (except Spain participants who receive aid in locating suitable housing and a monthly housing stipend of up to €500 instead) and ground transportation between the airport and college abroad provided by the host institution abroad, and an economy-class round-trip ticket by the most direct route reimbursed by ICISP (except Austria participants who must pay their own airfare and China participants whose airfare is paid by the College of Lake County).



England & Ireland

Participants will teach classes and/or prepare and give lectures as assigned. They will also attend the Modern Britain/Irish Experience classes with the students, oversee and provide leadership for the program and students, hold office hours, serve as chaperone on all field trips, and other duties as assigned.



Spain

Participants teach a course, in English, not currently taught at the International College of Seville. In addition, they will oversee and provide leadership for the program and students, hold office hours, serve as chaperone on all field trips, and other duties as assigned.

SUMMER OPPORTUNITY



Costa Rica

Selected participants will serve as ICISP Assistant Director for 40 students in San José, Costa Rica. The responsibilities of the ICISP Assistant Director will include working as a team with the directors administrating the program, participating in the pre-trip orientation, grading student essays, and other duties as assigned. Spanish language skills are not required for participation. Participation includes round-trip airfare, accommodations, and most meal expenses.

Two-Week

International Professional Exchange

ICISP offers a Two-Week International Professional Exchange to China, the Netherlands and Finland. Each participant will be matched with a colleague who may share similar job responsibilities. During the exchange, participants may observe classes, participate in lectures, give presentations, visit other colleges and universities, and observe the programs offered at the host institution. U.S. participants will host their exchange partners in mid-October, and will complete their portion of the exchange in May.

These exchanges involve home stays in order to minimize costs and increase cultural exposure. Each participant provides lodging, meals, and transportation for his/her exchange guest. Accommodations do not need to be elaborate, but participants should be provided their own bedroom during the stay. The host college pays the airfare and the administrative fees for the participant. Gifts and optional travel are the participant's responsibility.

Site Visits

ICISP coordinates annual site visits to its study abroad locations in order to better assist ICISP representatives as they market and promote these programs on their campuses. ICISP representatives, faculty, and administrators at all ICISP member colleges are encouraged to participate in these weeklong opportunities. Please contact your ICISP representative to obtain information on the scheduled locations and the approximate costs.



Austria

Instructors assigned to the one-week teaching position at Salzburg College in November/December or March/April will be expected to aid with students in the study abroad program, co-teach one of the courses offered during that particular semester, conduct guest lectures/seminars, and participate in student activities and field trips. Unlike other semester offerings, this visiting faculty position is a one-week assignment where the faculty member selects the week from the dates listed in the application.



China

Participants teach 2-3 courses and oversee and provide leadership for the program and students, hold office hours, serve as chaperone on all field trips, and other duties assigned.
