1. Program highlights

EnrichED Perspectives: A Journey in Strengthening Indigenous Knowledge for Educational Leaders is a professional development program open to faculty and administrators at academic institutions who want to integrate Indigenous knowledge and practices into education and engagement, and understand the relevant history of colonialism in higher education and its legacy in the present day.

Throughout the program, experiential learning will take place. Participants will be taken to the Woodland Cultural Centre to visit the local Indigenous community, Six Nations of the Grand River. By participating in these activities, individuals will enter into a cultural learning experience with the Haudenosaunee people, promoting an understanding of the community and their history of resiliency.

The program includes discussions on the challenges stemming from anti-Indigenous racism and wise practices for campus-wise justice and reconciliation-based initiatives. This experiential professional development program helps participants develop concrete lessons, tools and resources that can support them in developing, enhancing, or expanding the Indigenous education and engagement work on their respective campuses.

Upon successful completion of the training, faculty participants will receive a Certificate of Participation.

4. Learning outcomes

Faculty and administrators will engage in an experiential professional development program focusing on practical lessons, tools, and resources to strengthen campus-wide Indigenous education and engagement, including discussions on anti-Indigenous racism, justice, and reconciliation, and a visit to a local Indigenous community.

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Acquire practical lessons, tools, and resources that support the integration of Indigenous ways of knowing, doing, and being into teaching practices and administrative responsibilities.
- Explore instances of anti-Indigenous racism within higher education and identify approaches to addressing it.
- Analyze reconciliation and justice-based initiatives at other educational institutions to understand the key factors contributing to challenges, successes, impact and sustainability.
- Develop strategies and wise practices for fostering collaboration and engagement that strengthen campus-wide Indigenous education and engagement.
