Farm Tour - Yamilleth's Farm - Today we are going to learn the concept farm to table. We will visit Yamilleth's farm; she and her family were one of the original settlers that move to Juanilama. They have been sharing their knowledge about farming generation after generation. We are going to have some fresh made chocolate, coffee, and sugarcane juice.

Juanilama Reserve - A 19 hectare protected
section of forest where we will be able to observe
some of the flora and the fauna of the rainforest.
At the end of the trail you will see a waterfall.
Monkeys, poison dart frogs, toucans, parrots are some
of the species typically found in the area.

Cooking Class & Dinner (included) - After a full day of activities we will meet with our host families to enjoy a cooking class experience. Our host Moms are going to teach us how to prepare traditional dishes such as empanadas, tortillas, picadillo and other traditional and delicious Costa Rican dishes.

DAY 4 - LA FORTUNA - Monday, December 15

Escuela Técnica Agropecuaria Integral (ETAI)

- Technical agricultural school located in Santa Clara, Costa Rica. It focuses on providing students with practical training and education in agricultural and livestock management, equipping them with the skills necessary for careers in the agricultural industry. The school emphasizes hands-on learning and sustainable practices, aiming to contribute to the local community and Costa Rica's agricultural sector. Upon arrival, we are going to be welcome and taken to explore the school, first to the academic area and then to the farm where all the action happens. We are going to have the opportunity to see the dairy cows, vermicompost and others.

Lunch at ETAI (Included)

North Fields Coffee/Chocolate Farm - North Fields Coffee & Chocolate Tour in Fortuna offers an immersive experience into the process of making high-quality coffee and chocolate. Visitors explore lush plantations, learning about the cultivation, harvesting, and processing of coffee beans and cacao. The tour includes tastings, where guests savor fresh coffee and artisan chocolate, while gaining insight into the rich history and sustainable practices behind both products. It's a perfect way to appreciate the flavors of Costa Rica in a scenic, educational setting.

DAY 5 - LA FORTUNA - Tuesday, December 16

Breakfast & Day Briefing

Finca Luna Nueva & Sustainability Lecture and Development of La Fortuna and San Isidro Peñas Blancas - Sustainable farm and eco-lodge located in the rainforest near La Fortuna, Costa Rica. Known for its commitment to organic farming, the farm grows a variety of tropical crops, including cacao, turmeric, and medicinal plants. Visitors can explore the lush surroundings through guided tours, learning about biodiversity, organic farming practices, and the farm's environmental efforts. Finca Luna Nueva offers a peaceful retreat, combining nature, wellness, and sustainability for an authentic Costa Rican experience. This sustainability talk provides an insightful look into Costa Rica's environmental efforts, focusing on the Country's Certification for Sustainable Tourism (CST) and the Blue Flag program, which promote eco-friendly practices. Participants will also learn about the development of the Peñas Blancas area and La Fortuna. exploring how local communities are working to balance growth with sustainability. The talk highlights efforts to preserve natural resources, promote eco-tourism, and support sustainable development for a better future for both the environment and the people.

Lunch at Luna Nueva (Included)

Muelle Cattle Auction Visit TBC - Prominent event in Costa Rica, specifically held in Muelle, a small town in the San Carlos region of the Alajuela province. It serves as a major cattle auction where farmers, ranchers, and traders gather to buy and sell livestock, particularly cattle. The event plays a significant role in the local agricultural economy, as the San Carlos region is known for its cattle farming.

DAY 6 - LA FORTUNA - Wednesday, December 17

Breakfast & Day Briefing

Travel to Tenorio Volcano National Park - (approx.1h30) Located in the northern part of Costa Rica, is renowned for its stunning natural beauty and diverse ecosystems. The park is centered around the active Tenorio Volcano and features lush rainforests, hot springs, and the famous Río Celeste. The river's striking turquoise-blue color, caused by a natural chemical reaction, is a major attraction. Visitors can explore hiking trails, waterfalls, and enjoy

birdwatching in this biodiverse area. The park offers a unique experience for nature lovers, with its vibrant landscapes and rich wildlife.

Lunch at Maleku Indigenous Village (included) The Maleku are an indigenous group located in the northern part of Costa Rica, mainly in the Alajuela province near the Tenorio and Arenal volcanoes. They are one of the smallest indigenous communities in the country. They speak the Maleku language, which belongs to the Chibchan language family, although the language is critically endangered, and many speak Spanish. Their worldview is deeply connected to nature, performing rituals to honor the spirits of the land. Traditionally, they were farmers, growing maize, beans, and plantains, but today many are involved in ecotourism, highlighting their cultural heritage. They are known for their handicrafts, especially wood carvings and textiles. Our visit it is going to be hosted by a community member who is going to explain us more about their wonderful culture. An art class is going to be part of the visit.



DAY 7 - PUERTO VIEJO TALAMANCA - Thursday, December 18

Transfer (approx 1 hour)

Best Pineapple Tour / Montelirio - Pineapple cultivation is a significant agricultural industry in Costa Rica, where the climate and fertile soil provide ideal conditions for growing this tropical fruit. The country is one of the world's largest exporters of pineapples, particularly to the United States and Europe. Costa Rican pineapples are known for their high quality, and the main varieties grown include the "Golden" and "Red Spanish" types. The crop thrives in the regions of Guanacaste, Alajuela, and the Caribbean lowlands, where it is produced year-round. Pineapple farming plays a crucial role in the economy, providing jobs and contributing to the nation's agricultural exports. Upon arrival to Montelirio, we are going to be welcomed by a local farmer that in a very dynamic and interactive way is going to explain to us how to grow pineapple organically. And for sure we are going to eat a lot of them during the tour.

Lunch at Palmitour (included)

Palmitour - A very authentic experience with a local family that has been working on their Heart of Palm farm for over 20 years. First we will enjoy a delicious lunch prepared with the most important ingredient, heart of palm, and then we are going to be taken by Doña Maria to the field where we are going to learn all the process necessary to plant and harvest Palmito, the heart of the palm tree.

Cahuita National Park - Located on the Caribbean coast of Costa Rica, known for its lush rainforest, diverse wildlife, and stunning beaches. The park is famous for its vibrant coral reefs, making it a popular spot for snorkeling and diving. Visitors can explore scenic trails through tropical forests, where they might encounter monkeys, sloths, and various bird species. The park also offers beautiful white-sand beaches and crystal-clear waters, perfect for

ACCOMMODATION INFORMATION:

Accommodation selection will be based on group size, gender breakdown and availability. As a standard, SAA will book participants in shared rooms of 2-6 people per room, unless otherwise requested, with ensuite bathroom. Each participant will have their own bed. Program leaders will have their own private room with en-suite bathroom. Specific accommodations and locations will be confirmed once final enrollment numbers are submitted to SAA, usually 3-4 months prior to arrival. Any single occupancy upgrades must be requested at least 100 days prior to departure to be accommodated.
